Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrew's,

What a strange and wonderful creature is this church of ours, the Episcopal Church. We are both Protestant and Catholic, hierarchical and democratic. We live between the tensions of these opposites. It can drive some people a little crazy. Recently I have experienced many of the strengths of our very complex heritage.

In September, as a member of the Diocesan Border Group, I assisted in the visit of about 40 of our Episcopal Bishops to the border. This came about as a challenge from Bishop Smith, who, rather than cancel the House of Bishops meeting in Phoenix as some called him to do after the passage of SB1070, invited the Bishops to explore the border for themselves. They visited Douglas, Agua Prieta and Naco and met with many people from the head of the Tucson sector of the border patrol, medical personnel, and ranchers, among others. They also met with the mayors of both Mexican border towns and visited Just Coffee, a computer lab for kids, and several churches and other organizations providing services to migrants sent back to Mexico. In October I attended our annual Diocesan Convention in Phoenix, along with our lay delegates, whom you elected last January at our Annual Meeting, Jack Boggess, Barbara Gray, Karin Rodes, Jean Windmiller, alternate Glenda Newman, Sr. Warden Jean Moehlman, and clergy delegates Deacons Skip Vellom and Jim Fitzsimmons. I recommend to you the reflections by Karin, Jack, Barbara, and Jean on page 11.

As many of you know our finances are very tight, as are those of most churches these days. Our expenses, even though we made serious cuts this year, are exceeding our income by about \$1000 a month at this point. We are looking forward to a fun and profitable Barbeque on November 6th, so please invite all your friends and keep selling tickets.

This is a wonderful parish with people from many backgrounds and cultures (US, Mexican and border culture) trying to live out God's call to us in tough times. I appreciate all that each of you do to respond to God's call to you. Know that we are being challenged to be even more generous and creative.

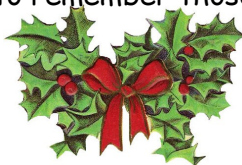

St. Andrew's Children's Clinic is non-denominational with its mission to provide medical treatment for disabled children of indigent parents in Mexico. This clinic is held the first Thursday of every month The volunteer doctors and specialists see between 200 and 250 children during clinic day. Church School at St. Andrew's: Just after the opening hymn at the 10 o'clock service if you happen to glance over to the right front you might see Pat Maitrejean and Glenda Newman walking out with the young people in the congregation. They're on their way to Church School

Church School is held weekly in the time slot between the first prayer at the 10 o'clock service and the exchange of the peace. We are using a wonderful curriculum developed by the United Methodist Church called The One Room Sunday School. The name says it all—essentially the materials are designed in such a way that we can teach children and youth of various ages at the same time. There is a basic lesson and then age appropriate activities. Those activities are varied to appeal to the different types of learning—visual, auditory, kinesthetic, etc.

The other great advantage of the curriculum is that is designed for volunteer nonprofessional teachers in mind. The curriculum provides essential background orientation and clear directions for the teaching and the activities.

This year we have been studying heroes of the Old Testament: so far we have covered Joseph and are almost through with our unit on Moses.

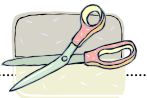
Go to www.eScrip.com Watch the demo. Read the Frequently Asked Questions. When searching for organizations, St. Andrew's Episcopal Church is ID #9607130, St. Andrews Children's Clinic ID is #500017062. The Preschool eScrip # is 500025225.

Be sure to register your Safeway card. Use the merchant directory on the eScrip page to order products on line. If you really want to help, download the program that automatically triggers eScrip every time you order from an eScrip merchant. The dollar amounts when all participate can be huge. Delegates to 50th Diocesan Convention Share their Experiences

Karin Rodes: The convention theme this year was "Back to the Future" - celebrating the Diocese's own history and opening ways for future growth. The highlight for me echoed "way, way back" in the human history of offering praise and thanksgiving. This began on Friday as Bishop Smith dedicated the chapel that Daughters of the King maintain for prayer. He spoke movingly and personally of his visit to Avila, it being St. Teresa's feast day; and the session ended with prayers in ancient Lakota and Navajo languages. Later that day, in a general session, we all began to learn simple chants and improvisations, accompanied only by a harmonium. This powerful ancient community musical sound (think "Old Testament" folks singing together in the desert, in Exile; or "New Testament" ones in a catacomb evading Roman prosecution) made Christ's presence in the holy meal even more real for me. Yes, I believe that I was able to discern His face even more in the hundreds of highly diverse others in the room. Thank you for electing me as a delegate from our parish; think about attending next year!

Jack Boggess: I would like to express my appreciation to the members of the congregation of St. Andrew's in Nogales for nominating and electing me a delegate to the 50th Convention of the Episcopal Diocese of Arizona. It was a wonderful experience for me to meet and listen to so many dedicated individuals from such a variety of parishes throughout the state. The Eucharistic Service Saturday morning was particularly impressive to me as the Bishop and his assistants performed the ceremony as it might be done in the National or Westminster Cathedrals. Musicians, a Cantor and a lady from Manhattan brought our 600 voices to wonderful harmony throughout the hall. It was apparent to me that our church is very inclusive of active men and women in both the clergy and its lay members. I was particularly interested in the number of young people that were recognized as working with the youth in the Diocese. It was mentioned that North Carolina has the largest growth percentage for Episcopal Churches in the United States. They attribute that growth to the Youth Ministry that they have been successful in cultivating. We at St. Andrew's must learn how to draw the young families to our church and provide entertaining spiritual activities for their children.

Barbara Gray: What a shot in the arm! I went thinking it would be all work and dull. It ended up being uplifting and inspiring and just plain fun! I guess what "fed" me the most was the Bishop's opening presentation (available on the Diocesan Website) about the fifty years past and the fifty years ahead (Back to the Future). That and his shorter presentation during the Eucharist on the reasons to be proud of being an Episcopalian. I have notes. Ask me if you're interested. It's nice to, once again, feel excited about our church!

Jean Moehlman: Just getting back from Convention, I am feeling very blessed! Blessed to belong to such a great Diocese, blessed to belong to such an awesome congregation, and truly blessed to have such a close relationship with God. During the convention, I had lunch with the Bishop and other Senior Wardens from around Arizona. I was asked more than a few times if I was lost or filling in for the Senior Warden. "Of course not," was always my answer with embarrassment from the asker. It was discussed as how to begin to get a more "youthful" congregation. The Bishop looked at me, smiled and said, "Get a younger Senior Warden"! I walked out of the lunch knowing that what I do for St. Andrew's is seen in more places than just Nogales! It was truly an awesome Convention weekend all around!
