



# ST. ANDREW'S NEWS

Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrew's,

I would like to thank The Rev. Patrick Maitrejean and The Rev. Derwent Suthers for stepping in as supply clergy for two Sundays each while I took some vacation and sabbatical time this summer. St Andrew's is blessed with these two retired Episcopal priests who make themselves available to assist us in many ways. The Rev. Skip Vellom and The Rev. Jim Fitzsimons continue to serve us as deacons, both at Sunday services, and in other ministries in the community, with Jim currently serving on the board of the Children's Clinic and as their treasurer.

As most of you know, every summer St. Andrew's finances get very tight, and we barely squeak through till fall. This summer was tighter than usual, in part due to the additional expenses we incurred this past year making urgent repairs to our aging building. The Vestry has taken a hard look at our finances as of August, and our Senior Warden, Jean Moehlman, has requested the Diocese to work with us in the short term to deal with the immediate situation, which may include a temporary reduction of my time and salary. We have also arranged for a representative of the Episcopal Church Foundation to meet with the Vestry and our Capital Campaign Committee in September to help us with the start of our Capital Campaign to deal with the longer term repair of and upgrading of our premises.

Two immediate ways you can help are to sell tickets for and to volunteer at our upcoming Home Tour fundraiser to be held Saturday the 24th of September. There are some fabulous homes in the old part of Nogales, including the former Rectory of this parish on Crawford Street, more details of which you will find in this newsletter. Also those of you who are able to make a special donation at this time, it would be of great help.

## Home Tour is coming

St. Andrew's Episcopal Church is hosting a Historic Home Tour Saturday, September 24, 2011, 11:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m. The tour begins in the Parish Hall with historic Church photos; displays from St. Andrew's Children's Clinic, St. Andrew's Preschool and Daycare Center, and Our House/Nuestra Casa Domestic Violence Shelter; Gourmet Table with items for sale; and Silent Auction items for bidding. The Church Mouse will be open. Guests can tour the Church to view stained glass windows and other items from the original St. Andrew's Church downtown. Refreshments will be served from the kitchen area.

Van transportation will be provided to Pimeria Alta Museum in downtown Nogales where people can view historic photos and



costumes before boarding cars to four nearby houses in the Crawford Street area, site of the original St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. The oldest home on the Holler Estate was built in 1912 by Sigrid and Pat Maitrejean's grandfather. The former St. Andrew's rectory was built in the 1940s and has been lovingly restored. The original Titcomb (Peggy Cumming's grandfather's) home was built in 1895 with a surrounding shell added in the 1960s. Details about the fourth house are forthcoming—watch the poster in the Parish Hall.

Ticket price is \$20, and proceeds will benefit St. Andrew's programming. Proceeds from the Silent Auction will be divided among the three charities noted above. Please volunteer to help with this important fundraiser. Also, tell others about the event and encourage them to attend. Flyers will be available for you to post in many places—stores, hair dressers, post offices, libraries, etc.

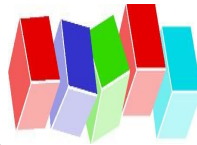


## The Library Page

Thanks to Barbara Gray who has donated several books including *Contemplative Compassion: Creating a Culture of Care in Faith Communities*, by Sarah Butler Berlin. This book shows us practical ways we can minister to hurting people when we are grounded in prayer and the Bible. It will be a valuable book for individuals as well as small groups. In either case the reader will grow in his own faith as he ministers to others.

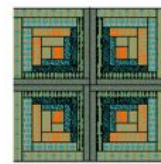
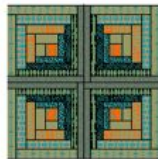
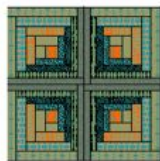
