Stewardship is a Way of Life

There is a story about two young people discussing their personal goals in life. One person's attitude was to get everything they could get for their self: money, property, automobiles, stocks, bonds and so forth. One might say they focused on reaping and gathering. They wanted to store up as many treasures on earth as possible. All they wanted was everything!

The other young person said that they believed God had given them a good life. They had a decent body, a fair mind, and some talent. Therefore, they said that since they were a Christian they thought that they should use whatever gifts they had to glorify God and to try to make this world a better place. They wanted to store up treasures in heaven. The treasures would be everlasting and no one could remove them from them.

That young person was trying to have a Christian attitude toward life. They realized that making a life is far more important than making a living. In fact, those who use their life to glorify God on earth find that somehow they have enough, often more than enough, to satisfy their worldly needs. This idea is summed up in the 23rd Psalm:

The Lord is my shepherd, I lack nothing. He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, he refreshes my soul. He guides me along the right paths for his name's sake. Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Surely your goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever.

Prayer: Dear Lord, make our minds and hearts restless until we strive first for the kingdom of God on earth as it is in heaven. In the name of Jesus. **Amen**

REPORT FROM DIOCESAN CONVENTION

The Episcopal Diocese of Arizona held our annual convention in Phoenix on Oct. 14 & 15, 2011 this year.

The keynote speaker was our own Rev. Canon Chuck Robertson, now Canon to the Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori. He started his talk by telling the story of how his daughter did a power point presentation on why the family needed a dog. He went on to say we can talk about our job, family, the trip we took, or any number of other things, but why can't we talk about the good news of Christ? He called on each person present to tell others our stories of what Jesus Christ means in our own lives. Maybe we should live out our story by being kind to the poor or the down and out, volunteering to help in the community, and being willing to listen to a person who just needs to talk to someone. Just maybe we as a Church can find a project to help the community of Nogales to show we are a caring Church. Think about this one for a time.

We passed four resolutions at the convention. 1. St. Paul's Church in Payson became a parish. 2. The first Sunday in Lent in the Diocese of Arizona was dedicated as Episcopal Relief & Development Sunday. 3. The Diocese called on The General Convention of the Episcopal Church meeting in 2012, to instruct the Public Policy Office in Washington D.C. to work with the Senate, Congress, and the Administration to develop a Comprehensive Immigration Reform law. 4. The Diocese of Arizona also asked the 77th General Convention to form a special commission on the reform of the structure of The

Thanks to all who made this year's Historic Home Tour a smashing success! (You know who you are!) We had great weather, great homes, and a great turnout. We had about 130 people who toured the homes. Almost all were impressed with the homes—"didn't know there were homes like this in Nogales." They really appreciated the helpful drivers and docents and enjoyed the tour of St. Andrew's Church, which highlighted the things that were brought from the original downtown church.

People learned about our church and its history as well as the history of Nogales. We had people from Nogales, Green Valley, Tucson, Scottsdale, Phoenix, Casa Grande, Bisbee, and Patagonia.

Our Silent Auction brought in \$82 for each of our 3 charities: St. Andrew's Preschool and Daycare Center, St. Andrew's Children's Clinic, and Our House/Casa Nuestra Domestic Violence Shelter. Net proceeds from the sale of the Home Tour tickets were \$2,109.40. ECW sold most of its gourmet table items. In total, this was a good fundraiser—and fun, too!

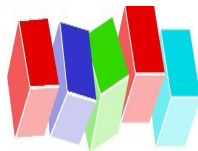


The Library Page

The Church Mouse has given the Library three new books. *Money & Faith: The Search for Enough* is a insightful collection of essays by twenty-three authors ranging from Henri Nouwen to Dave Barry and edited by Michael Schut. While it also has a good study guide for group discussion, it would be very helpful for an individual to read. This book looks at the important questions of “How much is enough?” and “Where is my security?” with wit and clarity.

The book *From Scarcity to Abundance: A Complete Guide to Parish Stewardship* by David M. Ponting is a very practical resource for any church. It tells the steps necessary to a successful year-round stewardship campaign or a capital campaign in a clear and engaging manner. I highly recommend both books.
