Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrew's,

Many, but not all, of you reading this newsletter will have read my Christmas letter about the upcoming transition year at St. Andrew's in 2012. The Congregational Support Committee (CSC) from the Diocese, which met with us in November, has recommended a transition to new leadership. I had a good meeting with Bishop Smith, and we looked at a year's transition during which time the Vestry and Parish members will need to follow through on many of the other recommendations from the CSC. The Vestry has embraced this process, which, over the course of the year, will entail some in-depth training in lay leadership and stewardship, as well as coming up with a near vision and mission for the parish. I will retire in February of 2013 by which time the Parish should be ready to move ahead with new clerical leadership.

Please plan to attend the Annual Meeting of St. Andrew's on January 29th as we will have some additional information to share and some important decisions to make. All attending St. Andrew's have the privilege of speaking at the Annual Meeting; members in good standing also have the privilege of voting.

After a year of responding to building crises and holding numerous fundraising events, energy in the parish seems to be moving toward deeper studies and spiritual pursuits. In response to requests for a Bible study at a convenient time for working members of the parish, we will hold a Bread and Soup Bible Study on Wednesday evenings this spring beginning February 8, at 5:30. Also note that the Episcopal Church Women (ECW) have decided to explore new directions in the coming year, so all interested women are invited to the next meeting on Monday, January 16 at 11:00 AM at the home of Polly Hyde in Tubac.

I am looking forward to a year in which we as a parish become open to new possibilities, new directions, new mission and new leadership.

St. Andrew's to host dinner in April for Presiding Bishop

The Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, Katharine Jefferts Schori, will head a group of Episcopal clergy and lay people participating in "Crossing Over", a conference and visit to the US-Mexico borderlands on April 12-14, 2012. The Conference is sponsored by the Diocese of Arizona and Episcopal Border Ministries. Rev. Lucie Thomas and Deacon Jim Fitzsimmons are members of the Diocesan planning committee for the visit, which will also take the group to Nogales, Agua Prieta and Naco, Sonora, Mexico, and Douglas, Arizona.

Members of the group will arrive in Tucson on April 12th and be brought in vans to Nogales. St. Andrew's will host a dinner in the Parish Hall that evening at which there will be several presenters with various perspectives on border issues. St. Andrew's committee members planning the visit to St. Andrew's include Sigrid Maitrejean and Andrea Privette as well as Lucie and Jim. We will need additional volunteers to help with logistics for the visit and dinner, so if you are interested please let us know.

Note that Rev. Lucie attended seminary with Bishop Katharine as one of five women from the Episcopal Diocese of Oregon who studied at the Church Divinity School of the Pacific in Berkeley, California, at the same time.



A New Year, New Beginnings for the Christian Steward

The practice of making New Year's resolutions goes back over 3000 years. The start of a New Year gives us the feeling of a fresh start, a new beginning, and new opportunities. If you are looking for some helps in your New Year's resolutions, here are a few ideas to get you started:

Practice gratitude – Cultivating a grateful heart is the hallmark of a Christian steward. Every day, express thankfulness to the Lord and to others. Seeing the good in your life will allow you to keep your heart compassionate and loving.

Encounter the Lord each day – Find time to be with the Lord each day, whether it be for an hour or ten minutes. Have a conversation with the Lord. Give your joys and worries to him as well. Allow God's love to transform them.

Be present to others – There is much celebration and mourning, joy and sorrow in people's lives. What a blessing it is to be able to share those times and not let others experience them alone! The gift of your presence to others is much more valuable than you realize.

Resist overwork – There is a pressure to produce, meet goals, be successful, but activities that lead us to overwork, constant fatigue and worry do not give glory to God. What God calls us to do we can do well. Be mindful that life requires balance, down time and letting go of unrealistic goals.

Nurture friendships – Our friends are those we choose to be with, those with whom we spend our evenings, with whom we vacation, to whom we go for advice. Friends are gifts from God who give us a greater appreciation of God's love for us. Friends need our time and love.

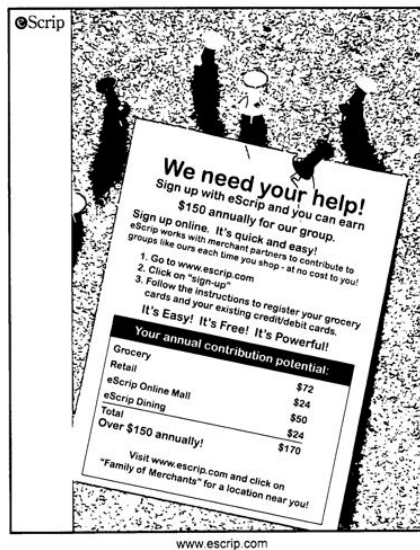
Heads up for eScrip
