Dear Members and Friends,

NOTE: For those of you who are far away or do not attend St. Andrew's on a regular basis, please turn to page 15 and read Lou Clapper's beautiful summary of this Winter of Our Discontent.

What a wonderful group of people you are here at St. Andrew's!

We have been through some tough times while waiting for months to get our electrical system brought up to date. And even with no heat you have kept coming to church in what has been the coldest winter in many years. Some of you older women have even showed up in long fur coats I expect you had to pull out of mothballs. Many of you have stepped up and joined work crews here at church on a number of occasions, especially the most recent two day cleanup after the cement dust snow storm in the church.

Others of you have stretched to donate additional funds for the electrical work and the purchase of two new furnaces. I would also like to thank our outgoing Junior Warden, Michael Anderson, for his faithfulness and patience, and our new Junion Warden, Rodger Babnew, for his jumping in with both feet and lots of energy. Thanks to you all.

The Vestry brought a proposal to the Annual Meeting of the Parish to do a Capital Campaign; we cannot continue to pay for repairing and upgrading a 40 year old building with loans from the Diocese, pledges and requests for extra funds several times a year as we did this year.

You approved the proposal, and five people volunteered for the Capital Campaign Committee: Buck Clark, Sigrid Maitrejean, Jean Moehlman, Carrie Pottinger and Andi Privette. I am arranging with Canon Timothy Dombeck for a representative of the Episcopal Church Foundation to come to give us an orientation for how to prepare for such a campaign. In addition to the main ideas our former Junior Wardens have suggested, we have asked the Preschool and the Clinic Boards to give us their ideas. This is a chance to dream not only of updating our premises, but to make this a 21st century building that will be more energy and water efficient.

I invite all our Friends as well as our members to contribute to forming a new vision for how this building can serve our mission for many years to come.

March 12 300TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF FR. A Lenten Discipline

This Lent, knowing that there are so many local families are struggling with lack of employment or underemployment, many of whom now depend on food from our local food banks, I suggest for a Lenten discipline that each of us bring a non perishable food item to church each Sunday as part of our offering to be donated to our local food banks.

Santa Cruz Council on Aging Comes to St. Andrew's Kitchen

Starting the second week in March and continuing for 2 to 3 months the Santa Cruz Council on Aging will prepare meals for their food programs at St. Andrew' while their working space is undergoing remodeling. As most of you know we remodeled and expanded our kitchen about 10 years ago to accomodate the crowds on Clinic Day. It is one of the best kitchens in the county and we are glad that it will serve this temporary need for an essential community program.

Looking for Help or Wishing for a Visitor?

As part of its "Acts of Kindness" theme for 2011, there has been some conversation at ECW about a visiting program for shut-ins. It has been suggested that we explore the possibility of having teams of folks involved in visiting those who would welcome someone coming by once a week. It would start with a visit from Reverend Lucie offering communion and or a visit--and then ascertaining if they would welcome visits in the future from parishioners. As a start, one person would head up a team (SIT - shut in team!) and help organize the visits. Others would sign up to visit people they particularly know or with whom they would enjoy increasing their connection. This idea is a work in progress and we're just beginning to develop it. St. Andrew's Episcopal Church Receives Painting of original Church

On Sunday, February 27, 2011 Carolyn (Wright) Temple and her husband Bill Temple presented to the St. Andrew's Episcopal Church a painting of the 1905 building of the original St. Andrew's Episcopal Church. The painting had been a gift to Carolyn's parents Carroll Wayne and Valettè H. Wright from the Arizona artist, Charles Jacobus. The painting will hang in the Vestry Room.

Mr. Jacobus painted the building for an art exhibit under the category of Scenes of Nogales; it won grand prize for its expertise and depiction of the Nogales church, which was torn down in order to build the interstate highway.

Mr. and Mrs. Wright came to Nogales in 1966 with the two youngest of their three children, Carolyn and Barbara (Barbie). They lived in Nogales and were members of the 1905 church until Mr. Wright received a promotion and new position in Arkansas. (Mr. Wright had been the District Manager of the Citizens Utilities Company.) During those years in Nogales, both Mr. and Mrs. Wright served in the church as well as their daughter Carolyn, who subbed as organist and sang in the choir.

Upon retirement from Mr. Wright's career on the East Coast, Carroll and Valettè returned to Nogales and again became active members of the Nogales community and church. Mr. Wright served on the vestry of the new church, and Mrs. Wright served on Alter Guild. They loved the area very much and enjoyed the reunion with their St. Andrew's church family, friends and, of course, Zula's Café!

When serious health problems kept Mr. Wright in Tucson hospitals, the Wrights felt the need to move closer to Bill and Carolyn. At this time they left the Nogales community but carried it in their hearts, returning to visit several times. Now through this painting, which was bequeathed to Carolyn by her mother, the Wright family returns through this gift.



Carolyn, Bill and Barbie, wish the St. Andrew's community God's peace and love. When the St. Andrew's community received the painting of the church during the service announcements February 27th, it was snowing...something this family loved. It was to Carolyn, confirmation that God had bestowed peace and love on the event. Happy endings are always the best, aren't they?

A lot of this work has been deferred in the past, and we can no longer defer any of these matters; it is time to act. I am not asking for money, I am asking that all of you to take a little time to take a look around in your homes, workshops, storage areas, sheds, etc. We need a lot of building materials and tools to get started, and if you happen to have any of the following materials or tools lying around and not of any use to you, please donate them to our Church for improvements and upgrades.

Items needed

Clear and white caulks

Wood fill

Glazing compound

Usable lumber

Fill-a-foam

Insulation strips (for doors and windows)

Any usable building materials in general

Caulking guns

Hammers

Screwdrivers

Putty Knives

Saws, any style

Any Misc. Tools

Water seal, i.e.; Thompson's , Behr, etc

After all the electrical is completed, I would like to start first by sealing up the building, repairing door and window gaps, sealing exterior outlets and switch boxes and water sealing the entire building after sealing up the doors and windows (This can save the church a lot of money in heating and cooling expenses.) Also we need to lay a membrane along the foundation where the ground meets the building's foundation to prevent any water penetration and infestations of subterranean termites or other insects.

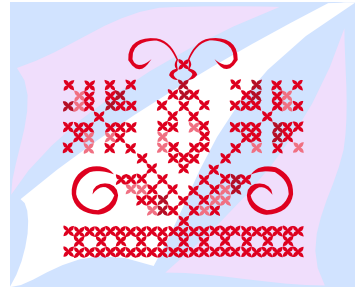
