Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrew's,

I am excited about our new leadership at St. Andrew's. Jean Moehlman is our new Senior Warden and Michael Anderson our Junior Warden (see page 5). Jean and Michael have already demonstrated new energy as have our Vestry members (over half of whom are new this year). Those of you who attended the Annual Meeting know that we are facing a larger budget deficit than normal, as are many other churches and non-profits. The good news is that very little of our income depended on funds invested in the market. St. Andrew's has always depended on pledges, donations and fundraisers. The not so good news is that we have fewer pledges this year than last, as some members moved and a few lost jobs making pledging uncertain for them, at least for the time being. And several regular pledges were reduced due to current economic conditions.

In the face of this deficit the Vestry has decided to move to a year-round stewardship program, rather than rely on a fall campaign only. In addition we plan to hold at least one or two additional fundraisers this year.

I ask those of you who are Friends of St Andrew's to please consider making a one time tax-exempt donation to us this year to help tide us over as we move into year round stewardship. St. Andrew's has survived hard times before, and with support from our friends and a year-round stewardship campaign we will do so again.

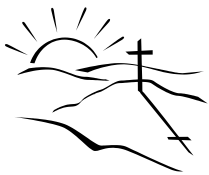

My Journey

I grew up in the Pacific Northwest, the most unchurched region in the country. Like most people in the area, my family was nominally Christian, but we never belonged to or attended any church. Sadly, we tended to associate church attendance with religious fanaticism, because the only people in our community who were vocal about their faith were the fundamentalists.

Fortunately, my viewpoint began to change when I enrolled in a course on the history of Christianity at the University of Washington, taught by Professor Donald Treadgold, an Episcopalian. Through this fascinating course, I learned that there were more enlightened versions of Christianity, and that those more open-minded denominations were in fact truer to our faith's historical roots. I discovered that there were churches that not only tolerated diversity, but celebrated it; churches that not only allowed questions, but encouraged them.

Dr. Treadgold's course reduced my hostility to organized religion, but it did not make me a Christian. It was teaching high school that forced me to get religion.

In 1996, I began my teaching career in the Mississippi Delta, the poorest region of the poorest state in the Union. Because of white flight to private segregation academies, Greenwood High School was 99% black. More than 90% of the student population lived below the poverty line, in shotgun shacks in violent neighborhoods dominated by gangs and drugs.

Although I managed to teach successfully there, it was difficult emotionally to cope with the pervasive hopelessness of my students' lives. It felt futile to teach kids to know history and speak German if their dreams of higher education and a better life could be wiped out so suddenly and arbitrarily by stray bullets and unplanned pregnancies.

I found solace in the church, in the beauty of our liturgy and ritual, in the belief that there is something more than this life, and in the idea that while suffering can be redemptive, it is our highest duty as Christians to devote ourselves to relieving the suffering of others, to lightening their loads and brightening their lives. We are God's hands; we are primarily responsible for doing his work in the world.

Like many of you, I wish I had more time to devote to the church. However, I have found that by pledging, I can be present, in some small way, in all of the church's good works.

Most of us are probably poorer on paper than we were a few years ago. These are difficult times. However, during economic downturns, people need the church's help more than ever, and the church needs resources in order to render that assistance. Those of us who have roofs over our heads, clothes on our backs, and food on our tables should consider that we are luckier than many people in this community, country and world. Surely, we can find it in our hearts to share with the church some portion of the blessings we have received through God's grace.

Millennium Development Goals and Lent

The Lenten season offers us an opportunity to renew ourselves spiritually and at the same time to see and respond to the suffering of others. Episcopal Relief & Development (www.er-d.org), part of our national church, has given us a booklet of Lenten meditations, *Peace & Compassion*, to help us on this journey. If you do not yet have a copy please pick one up the next time you are at church.

In the year 2000 all the member states of the United Nations pledged to achieve eight goals by 2015. They said, "We will spare no effort to free our fellow men, women, and children from the abject and dehumanizing conditions of extreme poverty, to which more than a billion of them are now subjected."

These Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) which our Episcopal Church supports are:

1. Eradicate Extreme Poverty and Hunger
2. Achieve Universal Primary Education for Children
3. Promote Gender Equality and Empower Women
4. Reduce Child Mortality
5. Improve Maternal Health
6. Combat HIV/AIDS, Malaria and Other Diseases
7. Ensure Environmental Sustainability
8. Create a Global Partnership for Development

There are many ways to help achieve these goals. We can pray -- at church, at home, alone, together. The ERD Lenten booklet can help with focusing your prayers. We can study -- in a group, through the Internet, reading the Bible or the newspaper. Come to the Wednesday 5:30 pm Bread & Soup discussions each week in Lent. We can give -- through Episcopal Relief & Development, to the MDG Inspiration Fund, buy alternative gifts for birthdays and Christmas, give Fair Trade coffee as a gift. We can act -- find out about white wrist bands and wear one, help to create the Parish Hall bulletin board each week with a new MDG goal, find out what others are doing and write an article for the next newsletter, staff an ERD table during coffee hour. You get the idea. There are lots of other ways.

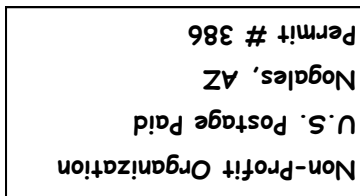
