Dear Members and Friends of St. Andrew's,

It's been a tough year for this country, for our local community in Santa Cruz County and for the whole world. The economic meltdown, continuing wars, threats to health, especially to young people and children from the new H1N1 virus, (you can name what other concerns you have here), have brought us to a very sobering time.

And yet I am hopeful for us, for our country and for the world. I'm beginning to hear an old phrase resurface, the 'common good'. Our Declaration of Independence speaks of the public good, but the term common good is perhaps of more ancient and widespread use.

Jonathan Sachs, Chief Rabbi of the United Hebrew Congregations of Great Britain in his book, *The Home We Build Together*, writes about the need of ethnically, religiously and nationally diverse peoples in our societies, and in our world, to willingly offer our differences as gifts to the common good.

I think of the Children's Clinic as a microcosm of people of two countries, two languages, and various religions, or of secular mind, coming together to create a space of common good to foster the health of seriously disabled children. It couldn't happen without the cooperation of health professionals, immigration professionals, translators, hospitals in Sacramento, Spokane and Hermosillo, donors from many different places, and people from all walks of life, rich and poor, who give their time to make it happen.

In hard times churches offer community and emotional and spiritual support to members and others in need. Sometimes financial support is available also. I think of one couple in our parish who have generously offered several thousand dollars as up front money so that a child of an uninsured family can have a needed operation.

It is in acts such as these that both local community and the larger society is knit together. May we at St. Andrew's continue to create the common good and grow in community together here on the border.

Junior Warden's Update, or "What I did this summer"

The basic construction for the expansion of the choir loft is now complete. It is now ready to have a floor covering applied, a decorative trim applied to the face of the riser, and the banister (with privacy curtain) installed. The Lockwood Family have very generously offered the donations in Memory of Charles Lockwood to be used for the choir loft project.

It was necessary to call in an air conditioning repairman to fix the evaporative cooler that serves the parish hall. The main motor burned out. Deadbolt locks have been installed on the kitchen storerooms. Please check with Lou or me if more keys are needed. Repair of the ceiling exhaust fan in the Day Care Center is in progress. The new motor for the fan has been purchased and installed into the fan housing. Installation into the ceiling will be done next week. A new bulletin board for church notices has been purchased and will be installed soon. Tom Cumming, at Davis Kitchens, has taken over the project of replacing the kitchen cabinet that is missing. We expect the cabinetry to be replaced soon.

Have you ever noticed the holder on the wall in the Parish Hall between the two bulletin boards? It is called a "Tract Rack" and the pamphlets in it are called "tracts". These are short little articles about a subject that usually has something to do with our faith or the Church. And thanks to your support of St. Andrew's and the ECW, they are all free.

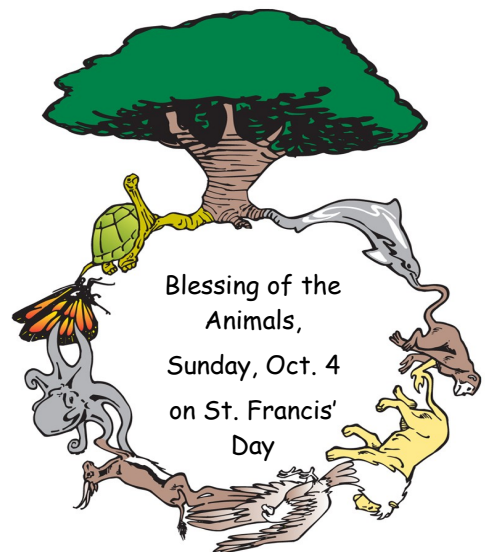
Annual Convention of the Women of the Diocese of Arizona

Stewardship Notes

In these very difficult economic times, it may help us to remember that the money that we give the church is a holy gift from a holy people.

Every other Saturday at Casa Blanca Chapel in Sonoita and twice every Sunday here in Nogales the faithful gather to hear God's word and to partake in Christ's meal when we celebrate the service of Holy Communion.

And both in Nogales and in Sonoita the offerings of the people of God are received and blessed: "All things come of you, O Lord, and of your own have we given you."

It used to be in the Episcopal Church that the offertory plates (or as we used to call them, the alms basins) were then hustled off somewhere out of sight--there was a sense that money is inherently dirty and shouldn't be left around holy things like the bread and the wine.

You may have noticed that now the plates remain up on the altar: for could there be anything holier than the gifts of God's people?

That money that we raise through our stewardship programs not only continues to provide adequately staffed places of worship for ourselves and for those who will join us in our spiritual pilgrimage; it also provides a place of healing and learning for various groups: Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous, the Children's Clinic, St. Andrew's Preschool, and professional training for early childhood education teachers through the Blake Foundation and Central Arizona College.

We will launch our Stewardship Program in October which will culminate with Pledge Sunday on November 15th.

We ask you to pray for St. Andrew's Church and our stewardship; that as God has blessed us, we in this wonderful parish church will be moved by the Spirit to bless others around us.
