I am looking forward to a renewal in our spiritual lives, to a deepened commitment to community and to further reaching out to others as Jesus reached out to those who needed to hear Good News.

## Congratulations to Brian MacKenzie...Patagonia Teacher of the Year

Brian MacKenzie has been chosen by his peers at Patagonia Union High School as their Teacher of the Year—making him one of 18 nominees for Santa Cruz County Teacher of the Year. Being a teacher is hard enough, but getting chosen to be honored in this way is huge. The young people in Patagonia are lucky, and we are lucky at St. Andrew's to have his leadership and gifts in our midst!

Brian grew up in the Seattle area, graduated from the University of Washington, and taught for five years in the Mississippi Delta before moving to Patagonia, where he teaches history and Spanish, and coaches football. PUHS Teacher of the Year wasn't even the most prestigious award he won last year: the Arizona Veterans of Foreign Wars also recognized him as the state's High School Citizenship Education Teacher of the Year.



He and Nick Kildahl are members of Secondhand Dog, a classic rock band that plays local venues. Last June, he appeared on the game show Jeopardy!, where he lost by one dollar.

Brian came to St. Andrew's in 2001, but his attendance was so inconsistent those first few years that on the rare occasions when he came to church, the congregation mistook him for a newcomer because no one could remember having seen him before. Since he started attending St. Andrew's regularly, Brian has served as a bilingual Lector and as Co-Chair of the TAG Team, which is developing a possible third service to be launched this fall (see article elsewhere in this newsletter). We appreciate you, Brian, and obviously, so do the people where you work. Thank you for all you do.

## Safeguarding God's Children is now online!

This is the only program for the prevention of child abuse approved by Bishop Smith for training our staff, our lay ministers, Sunday School teachers, Vestry members, and all who work with children in our church, our Preschool, and at the St. Andrew's Children's Clinic.

Rev. Lucie is now our Parish Administrator for the online version of the program, and Carrie Pottinger is the first one to sign up to take it online. If you work with children in any of our programs and have never had the training, or have not updated within the last five years, please speak with Lucie about taking the online class



## Preschool update

Preschool classes began August 4<sup>th</sup>, after the July break. Enrollment is up this year with a total of 38 children in the program. Twenty of them stay for aftercare and an additional 7 children come for aftercare from other schools. We have taken some additional security measures at the school in response to an incident where a child managed to leave the building unnoticed. (He was returned safely, thanks be to God.) A new gate was installed between the entrance door and the classroom area, an extra latch added to the screen door and an extra higher doorknob on the door leading to the office. We also hired an additional teacher, Maria Jesus Martinez, whose previous experience was with Head Start and the Boys and Girls Club. She is caring and the children like her.

# The Season of Creation

We will celebrate what is becoming our annual Season of Creation, from Sunday, September 21<sup>st</sup> through Sunday, October 12<sup>th</sup>. The season will highlight God's love for all of creation, creation care in our time (including lowering our carbon footprint as individuals and as a church community) and connecting to the lives of people in other parts of the world through support of the Millennium Development Goals to halve extreme poverty worldwide by the year 2015.

**We will kick off the season on September 21<sup>st</sup>** with a presentation after the 10 am service on global warming by guest speaker Rob Smith, a member of Trinity Cathedral in Phoenix, and Chair of Trinity Outreach Ministry. Rob has worked for the Sierra Club since 1981 working to protect wilderness, parks, endangered wildlife, and clean air and water, and says he feels called to focus on climate change due to global warming to protect all of these other things.

Be sure to mark your calendar for the **annual Blessing of the Animals on Sunday, October 5**, as we celebrate St. Francis's Day. All of us humans are invited to bring our pets and other animals to church that day for a blessing. Fr. Patrick Maitrejean will preach that day and there will be treats for all God's creatures at coffee hour.

This year we invite each of you to reflect on our care of God's creation. What you are thinking about this? What you are doing to leave a healthier planet to our children's children and beyond? You may want to bring in a photo of your clothesline, or of the solar panels on your roof, to post on the bulletin boards. Or perhaps you might want to write a poem about God's creation or a song with living lightly tips. How about making your own creation care video or doing a small skit during coffee hour?
